

With the EXTENDED ACCESS SERVICE, the court can allow designated court personnel access to non-public data.

By default, JUDICIII shows the same information to judge or probation officer subscribers that it shows to the public.


If the court chooses to participate in the EXTENDED ACCESS SERVICE, it can set up distinct "Security Groups" that have the right to see specific data not available to the public, such as juvenile cases and addresses.

Who might use this service?

- The Circuit Clerk on nights/weekends
- Judges needing data after working hours
- Attorneys of Record for access to sensitive cases
- Probation officers from the court or circuit

## How is it done?

When you first setup JUDICIUI, you tell us what to show and what to hide from the public. Similarly, when you setup your Extended Access, we help you setup distinct security groups, defining the additional data each group can access. After that, you simply add approved users to the appropriate group.
